

What Does Faith Mean? “Who Am I?” Game Cards

To print the “Who Am I?” cards:

You can use regular printer paper but they won't be “cardy” so I recommend cardstock. Cut out on the dotted lines.

To use the “Who Am I? Cards:

You can use them as quiz cards or game cards.

All of the individuals on the faith set of cards have something to do with faith. They may have been said to have faith, had their faith tried, *not* had faith, or said something about faith. You may use that fact as a clue, or keep it a secret and use other clues.

For **quiz cards**, one person simply “quizes” another person on the individual on the card, using clues as necessary. You can use your own knowledge of the individual to make up clues or look up the texts to learn more. For learning more about the meaning of faith, using clues that relate to the “faith” story or statements included in the clues would be great, but you can certainly use other clues too.

To use the cards for a game, you can make up your own game or use rules from a known game.

1) Do you play another guessing game that uses similar cards? Use it's rules!

2) Play a version of “20 Questions.” Short version of what that is: person with card gives one starting clue (“This is an Old Testament character,” “I'm thinking of someone who wasn't happy.”). The guesser can ask up to twenty questions (with “yes” or “no” answers) to learn who the person is. For example:

Person with card: I'm thinking of an Old Testament character.

Guesser: Was this person male?

Person with card: No.

Guesser: Was this person the wife or concubine of a patriarch?

Person with card: No.

Guesser: Did she have a miracle baby?

Person with card: No.

If the guesser gets points (which is usually the case in games), they get more points for guessing the character sooner (for example, twenty points for picking the right person with the first question, nineteen for picking the right person with the second question, etc.). You decide how many!

3) Play a game where the player with the card has to get his or her teammates to guess the name on the card but the player with the card can only answer “yes” or “no” to questions (or “I don't know”) and cannot use any form of the keyword (in this case “faith”). You also make other words “taboo” like the names of the books the clues are from, the person's title, etc. You would have to decide what is taboo at the beginning of the game.

4) Make up your own game!
